Services in Carroll County for Young Children: Where Should I Refer?

E-SMART

Who: Children 0-8 who live in Carroll County.

What: Mental Health Consultation, Psychological Testing, Family Navigation, Home Visiting (Parents as Teachers and Attachment and Biobehavioral Catchup)

Why: Concerns about behavior (tantrums, defiance), social emotional development (making friends, expressing feelings, self regulation), trauma, attachment concerns

These children may also receive B-K or other services, but have additional unmet behavioral health needs.



Birth-Kindergarten

Who: Children Birth-Kindergarten entry with suspected delays in speech, education, motor skills, or pre-academic concerns.

What: Assessment, IFSP/IEP development (if 25% delay is present), individualized interventions targeted at addressing areas where delays are present

Why: Delays in speech, gross motor, fine motor, educational (pre-academic), or social emotional development.

Come Learn with Me

Who: Children 0-5 living in Cranberry Station, Robert Moton, Taneytown, or Elmer Wolfe districts OR who have an IEP/IFSP.

What and Why: Increase parent support and knowledge of developmental milestones and early learning through playgroups, social connections, developmental screenings.

Parents as Teachers

Who: Children 0-5 (and expectant parents) who live in Cranberry Station, Robert Moton, Taneytown, or Elmer Wolfe districts.

What and Why: Increase parent knowledge of development and improve parent practices, provide early detection of developmental delays and health issues, prevent child abuse and neglect, increase children's school readiness and success.



Outpatient Mental Health Clinic (OMHC)

Who: Children 4 years and older*.

What: Mental Health Counseling (individual and/or family work); Psychiatric Services (at some OMHCs)

Why: Extensive mental health concerns outside of developmental age and stage (trauma, behavioral issues, anxiety).

*Some OMHC's offer therapy for children under 4, such as Parent Child Interaction Therapy (PCIT).

Note: Psychiatric Rehabilitation Program (PRP) Services are available at some OMHCs. This provides children 6 and older with a structured mentorship. Children work on goals that compliment their work in therapy with PRP staff in the community.
